## **2017 Property Taxes**

2017 Property taxes are in the mail.

If you did not receive your invoice please contact the town office even if your taxes are paid by a bank, you would still receive a copy of the invoice. Tax payments can be made by monthly instalments. Payments are accepted by Visa, Debit, MasterCard, cheques and cash as well as post - dated cheques. The town office is open between the hours of 8:30 to 4:15, Monday to Friday. The office does not close for lunch. Online banking is available with RBC, TD, Scotia Bank and Bank of Montreal. The Town Council has a ten percent seniors discount in place, if you are a homeowner and 65 or older you need to bring identification to the town office with your date of birth on it. If you are already the registered home owner and paying taxes, you will only need your ID. If you are not the registered home owner then you would need a copy of your deed showing you as the owner plus your ID.

## **Garbage**

The Town Council of Flatrock asks all residents to cover garbage at all times or put in a garbage box. If you are not using a garbage box do not put any garbage out until garbage day. Garbage has to be out by 8.a.m. on garbage day. The Town Council of Flatrock has received some concerns from residents regarding garbage being left around on properties that is attracting rodents, please try not to leave garbage around and use a garbage box if possible. Garbage day is every Wednesday.

## **Gobag Flyers**

The GoBag flyers will not be delivered to a property unless a gobag box for your flyers is installed on your property, this is free of charge. An outside box is set up at the Flatrock Town Hall [in the porch] and Wilkinson's Convenience for anyone who would like the flyers and do not have a gobag tube.

## **Snow Clearing**

The Town Council would like to remind residents **NOT to park on sides of road** so our snow clearing equipment can have room to clear the town roads. Remember you are **NOT allowed to shovel snow** out in to the road or across the road to cause an obstruction to traffic. The Town is not responsible for any damages incurred to any fence or garbage box that is not set back 17.5 ft. from center of any local road and 33.5 ft. from any highway. The town has a priority list of roads to follow and our children's safety and school bus runs are at the top. Please watch for children waiting for school buses during our snow season, remember "Snow means Slow".

## **Suspicious Activity**

The Town Council of Flatrock ask if any residents witness any suspicious activities in your neighbourhood, you should call the [RNC] Royal Newfoundland Constabulary immediately at 911 or 729-8000. We have been hearing from some residents regarding high speeds on our side roads, strange vehicles congregating in cul- de- sacs and reckless ATV driving. If someone goes through your car and takes any items you should notify RNC as there may be other property in your area having the same issue. The town has contacted the RNC and they suggest that any residents with concerns should call the above numbers to file a confidential complaint. In the meantime the RNC confirmed that they will be stepping up their presence in areas of concern.

The Torbay Volunteer Fire Department has requested that if possible all residents have **visible house numbers** placed on their homes **in case of emergency**. Thank you to the many residents who already have their house numbers on display.

Torbay Volunteer Fire Department would like to remind residents if any alarms even **Carbon Monoxide alarms** activate in your home to exit your home immediately and call 911. Gather all family members and pets at a predesignated safe place, whether it is in a vehicle, detached building or a point outside. Make sure everyone is accounted for. Call 911 and do not re-enter the house until it is deemed safe to do so.

Torbay Volunteer Fire Department ask residents to check the batteries in their **smoke detectors**. A good time to check them every year is when the clock changes. The clock goes ahead this year on **March 12**.

### **Home Renovations**

The Town Council of Flatrock now has a **Renovation Permit** for all renovations in the Town Of Flatrock. You will need to fill in an application stating what renovations you are having done. The application does not need to go to a Council meeting. Renovation Permits are \$25.00.

Compost bins are available for anyone interested in having one. Cost is \$21.99 plus \$2.86 tax, total \$24.85 each. If you would like to have a compost bin you can drop by the town office and pick one up.

BizPal's web-based, self-service application is practical, free and easy to use. Using a question and answer format, BizPal generates an accurate, timely and customized list of permits and licences that entrepreneurs may require for starting or growing a business.

Permits are needed for all sheds even movable sheds, please contact Town Office for details. If you have a shed on your property the permit application is \$10.00 and permit costs 20 cents a square foot with a minimum cost of \$30.00. You can be asked to remove a shed if you do not have a permit for it.

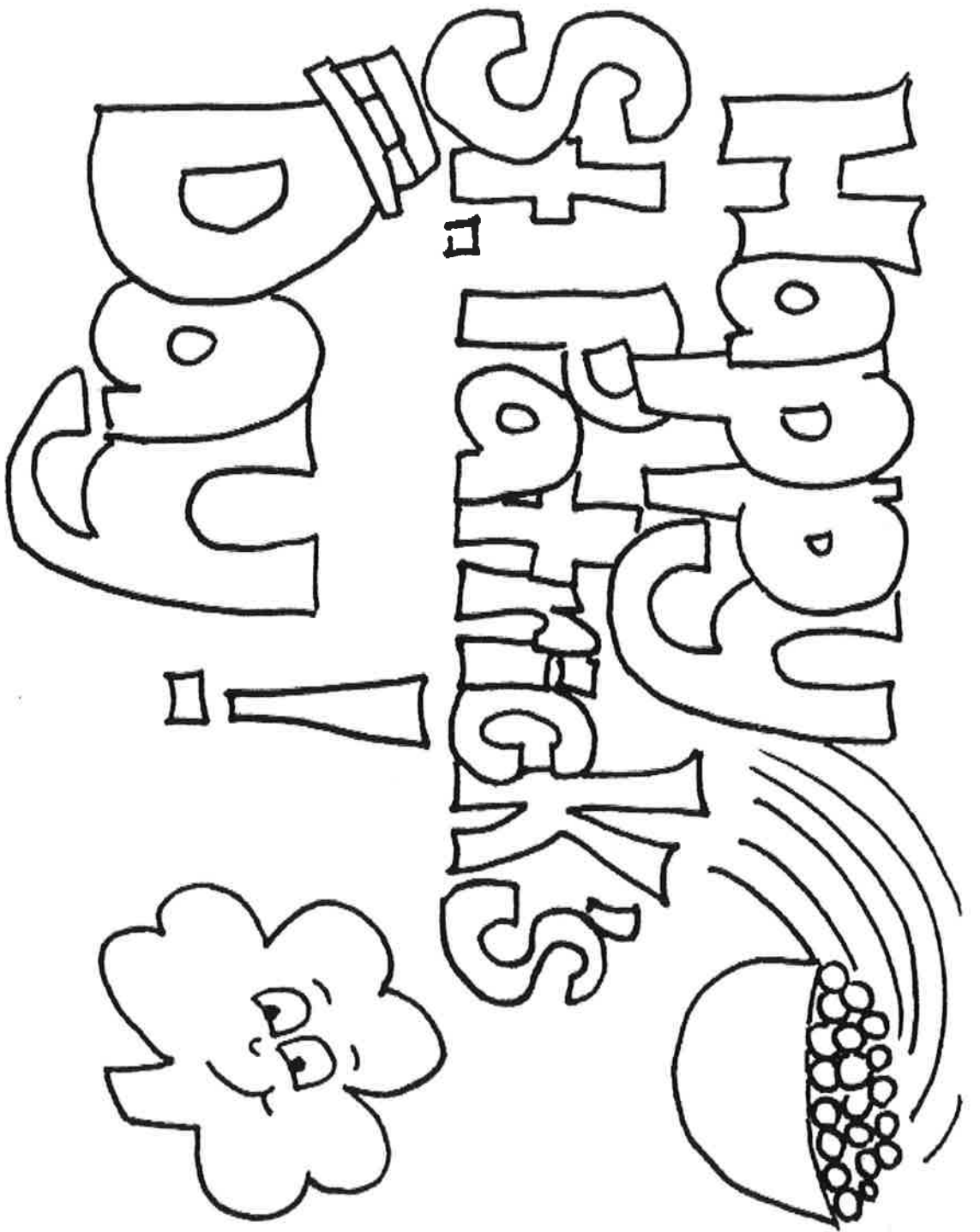
